## WHAT TO EXPECT

### Where do I go to experience the Hope Heal Renew: Our Journey Continues Virtual Conference?

- A) To join the conference -go [www.HopeHealRenew.org](http://www.HopeHealRenew.org) and sign in with the User Name and Password that you created when you originally registered. The Dashboard is your home base. Think of it as the *registration lobby*. You will have access to all the features of the conference from there. If you forgot your password you can request to change your password for accessibility.
- B) **NOTE: You are welcome to attend the OPEN CHECK-IN on Thurs Nov 4<sup>th</sup> from 3:30 pm – 6:30 pm PT**  
Log on to the website and our volunteer staff will answer any questions about the website and conference.
- C) For the best experience – join us on a computer or tablet. That will allow you to see the chat sessions.
- D) Roam around the website so you are familiar with how to find where to listen to the various live and pre-recorded sessions, just like you would *walk the halls of a conference center* to familiarize where everything is located.

### How can you learn about the presenters and the presentations?

### What's the Resource Center? And how does it work to visit one of the sponsors or exhibitors for the event?

### How is this Virtual Conference Experience like an in-person conference?

This conference is more like an in-person event than you may realize. The content is the same as what you would have in-person – we are just delivering it differently to you this year. Instead of going to individual *breakout rooms*, just go to the [Schedule/Agenda](#) for access to all the presentations. You will have to get your steps in a different way because your mouse or finger is doing all the work! You can pick and choose which sessions you want to attend - assuming there is space left in the meeting room.

You will have the added advantage of being able to attend both live and pre-recorded sessions. The pre-recorded sessions can be accessed by going to the button labeled “pre-recorded sessions”. After the conference is over we will place all the live sessions that were recorded and add them for viewing. All 75 sessions will be accessible until the end of the year – Dec 31, 2021. You have about 8 weeks to visit the website for content! There is no need to purchase recordings of workshops you didn't attend!

### You can also take part in any of the Live Zoom Chat Sessions

Friday and Saturday morning starts with coffee hour, a time to chat with the planners and other attendees. This is a chance to “see” familiar faces and make new friends! Just like meeting in the *food service area* for a morning cup with friends! We will wrap up the conference Saturday afternoon with diocesan gatherings to reflect on the experience of Hope Heal Renew.
